- 2. Avoid discipline specific jargon in the IRB protocol and informed consent. Documents and materials should be written so that an individual with limited education in the field can easily read and understand yours reach purpose.
- 3. A faculty or staff member must serve as thremany Investigator (PI) on any seach project conducted by a stuent. This includes all graduate and undergraduate end undergraduate end dissertations.
